

Group Discussion Questions

1. Sometimes we have no idea what has been planted deep down inside us. Most did not know that the Atacama Desert could grow so many flowers in its desert soil. The caterpillar has no idea that it will become a butterfly. What do you hope will come of the time, effort, and energy that you will put into this study? Do you sense anything deep within you that is soon to emerge?
2. There are four stages in the life-cycle of a butterfly (metamorphosis). Egg—the butterfly begins its life. Larva—the caterpillar hatches from the egg, eats a lot, and grows a lot. Pupa—the chrysalis stage where the caterpillar forms a cocoon around itself and rests. It is transforming. Adult—the butterfly emerges, lives freely, and reproduces itself. We move in and out of these stages as well in our spiritual journey. As you think about your spirit being aligned with God’s Spirit, where are you on your journey presently? How do you need to grow to experience more of the life Jesus has already given you?
3. God has breathed life into us. We are a carrier of the breath of God—the essence of God’s identity is within us. Discuss the idea of God breathing life into us and us holding His very essence. Did you know you were a carrier of the breath of God? How does that make you look at yourself or others differently?
4. What does the word “masterpiece” mean to you? Do you believe you truly are a masterpiece of His creation and that you were a masterpiece long before you ever showed up on this earth?
5. Elizabeth read a paraphrase of Job 10:12. “You have fashioned, crafted, and made my life, and your zealous love and kindness, your favor, custody and care have kept and guarded me and given heed of my spirit like a gardener watches his garden or a shepherd watches his flock.” What is your initial reaction or response when you hear this?
6. Discuss the idea of God as a gardener and as a shepherd. How do these images reflect God taking care of and watching over your spirit? How do you feel or want to respond?
7. In John 10:27 Jesus refers to Himself as a Shepherd when He says, “My sheep hear My voice.” Have you ever felt God, your Great Shepherd, speaking to your spirit? If yes, what was this experience like?

The concept of your human spirit and God’s spirit may be new to you. We will continue to explore the principle of spirit, soul, and body in Scripture throughout this study.
